ORDER EXTENDING TIME

By Decision No. 77228 dated May 19, 1970 in Application No. 51346 the Commission authorized Holiday Airlines to operate as a passenger air carrier to serve Truckee-Tahoe Airport and ordered Holiday Airlines to establish service within 120 days after the effective date of the order. By letter dated September 15, 1970 Holiday Airlines informed us that tests on the runway at the Truckee-Tahoe Airport register safe maximums of only 85,000 pounds gross landing weight. At this airport Holiday Airlines expects to use Lockheed Electra jets which are designed to operate at a maximum landing weight of 95,600 pounds. Holiday Airlines asserts that to operate at an 85,000 pound weight maximum would increase operating costs and reduce revenues to such an extent that economical operation would be improbable. Holiday Airlines says that the public entities involved are making efforts to obtain funds to resurface the runway. Holiday Airlines requests an extension of time within which to inaugurate service to Truckee-Tahoe Airport.

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Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Holiday Airlines, Inc. is granted an extension of time to establish service at the Truckee-Tahoe Airport until October 1, 1971.

The effective date of this order shall be the date hereof.
