## SECOND SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER

Pacific Express Transportation (formerly known as M & R Leasing, Inc.) is a highway common carrier operating under a certificate of public convenience and necessity issued by this Commission. John Paul Fischer, attorney for Pacific Express Transportation, has submitted to this Commission an amendment to the articles of incorporation of Pacific Express Transportation changing its name to Lee Way Motor Freight of California, Inc. Accordingly, its certificate will be amended to show the new corporate name and it will be ordered to amend its tariffs pursuant to General Order No. 80-A. A public hearing is not necessary.

Good cause appearing,

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. Decision No. 65706 dated July 16, 1963, in Application No. 45469, as amended by Decision No. 72668 dated June 27, 1967, is further amended by substituting "Lee Way Motor Freight of California, Inc." in place and stead of "Facific Express Transportation".

2. Within one hundred twenty days after the effective date hereof, and on not less than 10 days' notice to the Commission and the public, Lee Way Motor Freight of California, Inc. shall amend its tariffs on file with this Commission as required by Rule No. 6.4 of General Order No. 80-A.

This order shall become effective twenty days after the date hereof.
