Decision No.__ 77923 BEFORE THE PUBLIC UTILITIES COMMISSION OF THE STATE In the Matter of the Application of THE OAKLAND TERMINAL RAILWAY and THE WESTERN PACIFIC RAILROAD COMPANY, jointly and severally, for authority to construct a spur track in and across Union Street and 7th Street in the City of Oakland, County of Alameda, State of California. Application No. 52040 (Filed July 15, 1970) ORDER The Oakland Terminal Railway and The Western Pacific Railroad Company are hereby authorized to construct an additional spur track at grade across Union Street and Seventh Street in Oakland, Alameda County, at the location described in the application, to be identified as a portion of Crossing No. 16-0.10. Construction of said crossing shall be equal or superior to Standard No. 2 of General Order No. 72, without superelevation and of a width to conform to the portion of the street as widened, with tops of rails flush with the roadway and with grades of approach not in excess of existing grades. Protection shall be by existing preempted traffic signals with one new "no right turn" indicator to be actuated with the existing traffic signal preemption for traffic bound in a southeasterly direction on Seventh Street. Applicant shall bear entire construction and maintenance expense. Within thirty days after completion pursuant to this order, applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall expire if not exercised within one year unless time be extended or if above conditions are not complied with. Authorization may be revoked or modified if public convenience, necessity, or safety so require.

Applicant has requested that the order authorizing the construction of the track as described become effective upon the date of its issuance in order that the industry to be served may make a mortgage commitment. The effective date of this order shall be the date hereof.
