SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

Decision No. 77089, dated April 14, 1970 issued ex parte in this application authorized the County of San Joaquin to widen the crossing of Eight Mile Road at grade with tracks of Southern Pacific Transportation Company, Crossing No. D-98.1 near the City of Stockton, San Joaquin County.

By Decision No. 77089, automatic protection consisting of two Standard No. 8 crossing signals (General Order No. 75-B) augmented with automatic gate arms was ordered to be installed in connection with the widening of said crossing.

Applicant and Southern Pacific Transportation Company have since executed an agreement providing for additional crossing signals mounted on cantilever arms as part of the original proposal.

IT IS ORDERED that protection at Eight Mile Road, Crossing No. D-98.1 shall be by two Standard No. 8 crossing signals (General Order No. 75-B) augmented both with automatic gate arms and additional crossing signals mounted on cantilever arms.

In all other respects Decision No. 77089 shall remain in full force and effect.
