SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

The Commission by Decision No. 77965; dated November 24, 1970, in the above entitled proceeding, granted Valley Airlines, Inc. (Valley) a certificate of public convenience and necessity to operate between San Jose and Bakersfield, and between San Jose and Santa Barbara.

The effective date of the Commission's order was fixed at December 14, 1970, and an additional five days beyond that date was set for actual commencement of service as a result of tariff and timetable filing requirements.

By letter dated November 25, 1970, Valley requests that the Commission make the effective date as soon as possible and require only one day's notice for filing tariffs and timetables. Valley states in its letter that it has received numerous daily requests from the public for immediate service, particularly during the holiday season.

The request is reasonable and will be granted.

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. The effective date set forth in Decision No. 77965, dated November 24, 1970, is revised to be the effective date of this Supplemental Order.

2. Paragraph 2(c) of the Commission's order in Decision No. 77965 is amended to provide that the tariff and timetable filings required in Decision No. 77965 shall be effective one day after the effective date of this Supplemental Order and upon one day's notice to the Commission and the public.

The effective date of this Supplemental Order shall be the date hereof.
