In the Matter of the Application of The Oceanic Steamship Company for an Order of Revocation of its certificate of public convenience and necessity.

Application No. 52308 (Filed November 19, 1970)

ORDER OF REVOCATION

The Oceanic Steamship Company requests revocation of its certificate of public convenience and necessity authorizing the transportation of passengers, passengers' baggage and passengers' automobiles when accompanying passengers as checked baggage between San Francisco, Los Angeles and San Diego.

The certificate was acquired by applicant from its parent company, Matson Navigation Company, by Decision No. 77403 dated June 23, 1970, in Application No. 51962.

It is alleged that on October 1, 1970, applicant entered into an agreement to sell the SS Mariposa and SS Monterey to Pacific Far East Line, Inc., and that the new owner does not plan to continue the operations heretofore conducted pursuant to the certificate by said ships. It is further alleged that the sale of the SS Mariposa and SS Monterey is subject to the approval of the Federal Maritime Commission and the Maritime Administration.

After consideration the Commission finds that public convenience and necessity no longer require applicant's service for the transportation of passengers, their baggage and their automobiles between San Francisco, Los Angeles and San Diego.

ORDER

IT IS ORDERED that:

- 1. Upon the filing of approval by the Federal Maritime
 Commission and the Maritime Administration of the sale by The
 Oceanic Steamship Company of the SS Mariposa and SS Monterey to
 Pacific Far East Line, Inc., The Oceanic Steamship Company may
 discontinue the transportation of passengers, passengers' baggage
 and passengers' automobiles when accompanying passengers as checked
 baggage between San Francisco, Los Angeles and San Diego and the
 certificate of public convenience and necessity granting said authority as set forth in Decision No. 77403 in Application No. 51962 is
 revoked.
- 2. Upon the filing referred to in ordering paragraph 1 hereof and on not less than ten days' notice to the Commission and to the public, applicant shall cancel the tariffs and time schedules presently on file with this Commission covering the operations herein considered.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
