ORDER EXTENDING TIME

Applicant requests extension of time to establish commuter service to the new Laguna Niguel facility under construction for the North American-Rockwell "Autonetics" plant at 24000 Avila Road, Laguna Niguel, California 92677.

By Decision No. 76203 in Application No. 51107 the Commission authorized Douglas Bus Lines, Inc., to extend its service as a passenger stage corporation to serve the North American-Rockwell "Autonetics" plant and was ordered to establish the service within 120 days after the effective date of the order.

Due to delay in construction of the facility the Commission by Decision No. 76421 extended the time for institution of the service to February 1, 1971. By letter dated December 22, 1970 the applicant states that the plant has not been completed and is not in use. However, applicant is still desirous of establishing bus service for plant employees from the nearest labor source, which is the Santa Ana and Anaheim areas, and requests another extension of time for institution of the service.

Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Douglas Bus Lines, Inc. is granted an extension of time to establish service to the North American-Rockwell "Autonetics" plant and the time within which applicant may exercise authority granted in Decision No. 76203 dated September 23, 1969 is hereby extended to February 1, 1972.

In all other respects said decision shall remain in full force and effect.

The effective date of this order shall be the date hereof.
