OPINION AND ORDER

On September 14, 1970, Air California filed a tariff under General Order No. 105-A which adopted a reduced adult fare for persons over 55 years of age when traveling in groups of ten or more. The reduced fare was 66-2/3 percent of the regular adult fare and was scheduled to become effective on October 10, 1970.

The Commission staff requested that the filing should not become effective prior to a hearing. The Commission issued an Order of Investigation and Suspension (Case No. 9131) on October 6, 1970 which provided for a hearing. Proposed Fifth Revised Page 5, Third Revised Page 5-A and Ninth Revised Page 2-A of Air California Cal. P.U.C. Tariff No. 1 were suspended until the Commission issued a further order in the proceeding.


A hearing was scheduled and on December 21, 1970 the Commission was notified by letter that Air California was withdrawing its application to lower the rates for citizens over 55 when traveling in groups of ten or more.

Therefore, IT IS ORDERED that:


1. The proposed Fifth Revised Page 5, Third Revised Page 5-A and Ninth Revised Page 2-A of Air California Cal. P.U.C. Tariff No. 1 scheduled to become effective October 10, 1970 are hereby rejected.

2. The investigation in Case No. 9131 is hereby discontinued. The effective date of this order is twenty days after the date hereof.
