<u>ORDER</u>

The County of Los Angeles is hereby authorized to construct a crossing at separated grades of Temple Avenue over the trackage of the Union Pacific Railroad Company, in the City of Pomona, Los Angeles County, at the location and substantially as shown by plans (Exhibit B) attached to the application, to be identified as Crossing No. 3-28.5-A. Construction and maintenance expense shall be borne in accordance with an agreement to be entered into between the parties relative thereto, and copy of said agreement, together with plans of said crossing approved by Union Pacific Railroad Company, shall be filed with the Commission prior to commencing construction. Should the parties fail to agree, the Commission will apportion the cost of construction and maintenance by further order.

Clearances shall be in accordance with the requirements of General Order No. 26-D. Walkway areas adjacent to the tracks shall be maintained free of obstructions and shall promptly be restored to their original condition in the event of damage during construction.
