O R D E R

Los Angeles Junction Railway Company is hereby authorized to construct an additional spur track at grade across Seville Avenue in the City of Vernon, County of Los Angeles, substantially as shown by plan (Exhibit A) attached to the application, to be identified as a portion of Crossing No. 25-1.19-C. Construction of said crossing shall be equal or superior to Standard No. 2 of General Order No. 72. Protection shall be by two Standard No. 1 crossing signs (General Order No. 75-B) reflectorized with reflex-reflective sheet material. No obstructions shall be placed or remain near the crossing signs which will impair the motorists' view.

Applicant shall bear entire construction and maintenance expense.

No train, engine or car shall be operated over the crossing until after the protection ordered herein is installed.


Clearances shall conform to General Order No. 26-D. Within the area of the grade crossing construction, walkways for a distance of 6' from the rail on both sides of the track, shall provide a reasonable regular surface with gradual slope not to exceed

1" vertical to 8" horizontal in all directions of approach in accordance with the provisions of General Order No. 118.


Within thirty days after completion pursuant to this order, applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall expire if not exercised within one year unless time be extended, or if above conditions are not complied with.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
