O R D E R

The City of Santa Ana is hereby authorized to construct Dyer Road at grade across two tracks of the Southern Pacific Transportation Company, at the locations described in the application, as amended, to be identified as Crossing Nos. BK-520.27 and BK-521.16-C.

Width of each crossing shall be not less than 64 feet and grades of approach not greater than two percent as shown on plan attached to the application, as amended. Construction of each crossing shall be equal or superior to Standard No. 2 of General Order No. 72. Protection at each crossing shall be by four Standard No. 8 flashing light signals (General Order No. 75-B) two of which to be supplemented with automatic crossing gates. Backlights may be omitted from the signals on the medians. No obstructions shall be placed or remain near the flashing light signals which will impair the motorists' view.


Applicant shall bear the entire construction expense, also maintenance cost of the crossings outside of lines two feet outside of rails. The Southern Pacific Transportation Company shall bear the maintenance cost of the crossings between such lines. The maintenance cost of the automatic crossing protection at each crossing shall be borne by the applicant, pursuant to the provisions of Section 1202.2 of the Public Utilities Code.

Clearances shall conform to General Order No. 26-D. Within the area of the grade crossing construction at each location, walkways for a distance of 6' from the rail on both sides of the track, shall provide a reasonable regular surface with gradual slope not to exceed 1" vertical to 8" horizontal in all directions of approach in accordance with the provisions of General Order No. 118.


Within thirty days after completion, pursuant to this order, applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall expire if not exercised within two years unless time be extended or if above conditions are not complied with. Authorization may be revoked or modified if public convenience, necessity or safety so require.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
