O R D E R

The City of Hayward is hereby authorized to construct Zephyr Street at grade across tracks of The Western Pacific Railroad Company in the City of Hayward, Alameda County, at the location described in the application to be identified as Crossing No. 4-25.67-C.


Width of crossing shall be not less than 48 feet and grades of approach not greater than five percent. Construction shall be equal or superior to Standard No. 2 of General Order No. 72. Protection shall be by two Standard No. 8 crossing signals (General Order No. 75-B).

Construction and maintenance costs may be borne in accordance with an agreement between the parties relative thereto. Should the parties fail to agree, the Commission will apportion the cost of construction and maintenance by further order.


Within thirty days after completion pursuant to this order, applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall expire if not exercised within two years unless


time be extended or if above conditions are not complied with. Authorization may be revoked or modified if public convenience, necessity, or safety so require. The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
