SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER

By Decision No. 78415 dated March 9, 1971, Accurate Cartage and Warehousing, Inc. and Joseph J. Rossini were authorized to purchase certain public utility warehouse authority from Hecht Fast Freight, Inc.

Applicant purchasers have requested authority to become a participant in California Warehouse Tariff Bureau, Warehouse Tariff No. 28-A, Cal. P.U.C. 193, Jack L. Dawson, Agent, in lieu of adopting the tariff of seller. In some respects the proposed rates would be higher than those presently being charged by applicant seller. The Commission staff has reviewed the proposed rates and found that they are the same as or comparable to the rates of other warehousemen located in the general area where applicant purchasers' warehouse facilities are located.

After consideration the Commission finds that the increases in the proposed rates, rules and regulations are justified. A public hearing is not necessary.

IT IS ORDERED that ordering paragraph 3 of Decision No. 78415 is amended to read as follows:

3. Purchasers may file and establish as their own the rates, rules and regulations set forth in California Warehouse Tariff Bureau, Warehouse Tariff No. 28-A, Cal. P.U.C. 193, Jack L. Dawson, Agent. The tariff filings shall be made effective not earlier than ten days after the effective date of this order on not less than ten days' notice to the Commission and the public, and the effective date of the tariff filings shall be concurrent with the consummation of the transfer herein authorized. The tariff filings made pursuant to this order shall comply in all respects with the regulations governing the construction and filing of tariffs set forth in the Commission's General Order No. 61-A. Failure to comply with and observe the provisions of General Order No. 61-A may result in a cancellation of the operating authority granted by this decision.

In all other respects, said Decision No. 78415 shall remain in full force and effect.

The effective date of this order shall be the date hereof.
