
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## OPINION AND ORDER

By this application, Western Motor Tariff Bureau, Inc., seeks authority, on behalf of M and M Transfer Company (M and M), to publish hourly rates, which vary according to the weight of the shipment, for the time the carrier's equipment is delayed in loading or unloading in connection with shipments that are transported under weight rates.<sup>1</sup>

Applicant states that M and M is a highway common carrier of general commodities between points in Los Angeles Basin Territory. A substantial portion of the carrier's intrastate revenue is derived from the application of hourly rates for the transportation of property within Los Angeles and Orange Counties. Applicant points out that the proposed hourly rates for delays in loading or unloading equipment are the same as the hourly rates established by the Commission for the transportation of property

within Los Angeles and Orange Counties. These rates assertedly are necessary to ensure that delays in loading or unloading will not become a burden on other traffic.

Applicant asserts that increases resulting from the proposal herein would not increase the California intrastate revenue of M and M by as much as one percent.

The application was listed on the Commission's Daily Calendar of January 15, 1971. No objection to the granting of the application has been received.

The Commission Transportation Division staff has analyzed the application and recommends that it be granted by ex parte order.


In the circumstances, it appears, and the Commission finds, that increases resulting from the proposal herein are justified. A public hearing is not necessary. The Commission concludes that the application should be granted.

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. Western Motor Tariff Bureau, Inc., is hereby authorized, on behalf of M and M Transfer Company, to publish rates for delays to carrier equipment in its Local, Joint and Proportional Freight and Express Tariff No. 111, Cal.P.U.C. No. 15, as specifically proposed in the application.

2. Tariff publications authorized to be made as a result of the order herein shall be filed not earlier than the effective date of this order and may be made effective not earlier than thirty days after the effective date of this order on not less than thirty days' notice to the Commission and to the public.

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3. The authority herein granted shall expire unless exercised within ninety days after the effective date of this order.

This order shall become effective twenty days after the date hereof.
