O P I N I O N

Eckdahl Warehouse Co., presently conducting operations as a public utility warehouseman in Los Angeles, requests a certificate of public convenience and necessity to operate as a public utility warehouseman for the storage of furniture in 40,000 square feet of space in San Francisco.

For many years, applicant has conducted a public warehouse operation as an accessorial service to the pool car distribution of shipments of furniture. In many instances, the storage of furniture is a necessary incident of pool car distribution. It is alleged that applicant has provided these combined services in Los Angeles for many years and has been requested to provide a similar service in San Francisco.

If the application is granted, applicant proposes to lease a one story building located at 336 Berry Street, San Francisco, from the Southern Pacific Railroad. As of November 30, 1970, applicant indicated a net worth in the amount of \$324,406.

Copies of the application were served on public utility warehousemen serving in San Francisco. No protest has been received.

After consideration, the Commission finds that public convenience and necessity require the granting of the application. A public hearing is not necessary.

O R D E R

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. A certificate of public convenience and necessity is granted to Eckdahl Warehouse Co., a corporation, as a public utility warehouseman, as defined in Section 239(b) of the Public Utilities Code, for the operation of storage or warehouse floor space as set forth in Appendix A attached hereto and made a part hereof.

2. In providing service pursuant to the certificate herein granted, applicant shall comply with and observe the following service regulations. Failure so to do may result in a cancellation of the operating authority granted by this decision.

- (a) Within thirty days after the effective date hereof, applicant shall file a written acceptance of the certificate herein granted. Applicant is placed on notice that, if it accepts the certificate of public convenience and necessity herein granted, it will be required, among other things, to file annual reports of its operations.
- (b) Within one hundred twenty days after the effective date hereof, applicant shall establish the service herein authorized and file tariffs, in triplicate, in the Commission's office.
- (c) The tariff filings shall be made effective not earlier than ten days after the effective date of this order on not less than ten days' notice to the Commission and the public, and the effective date of the tariff filings shall be concurrent with the establishment of the service herein authorized.

(d) The tariff filings made pursuant to this order shall comply with the regulations governing the construction and filing of tariffs set forth in the Commission's General Order No. 61-A.

3. The certificate of public convenience and necessity granted in paragraph 1 of this order shall supersede the certificate of public convenience and necessity granted by Decision No. 74848, which certificate is revoked effective concurrently with the effective date of the tariff filings required by paragraph 2(b) hereof.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.

Eckdahl Warehouse Co., by the certificate of public convenience and necessity granted in the decision noted in the margin, is authorized to operate as a public utility warehouseman as defined in Section 239(b) of the Public Utilities Code for the operation of storage or warehouse floor space, restricted to furniture and commodities generally handled in connection with the furniture business, as follows:

City of Los Angeles	140,000
City of San Francisco	40,000

(The floor space shown is exclusive of the expansion permissible under Section 1051 of the Public Utilities Code.)
