In the Matter of the Application of the City of Oxnard, Ventura County, California, for an order granting permission to the City of Oxnard for the construction and Maintenance of a Public Street Crossing over the Ventura County Railway between existing Public Railway Crossings on said Railroad No. 45C-0.78 and 45C-0.82.

O R D E R

City of Oxnard is hereby authorized to construct westbound Wooley Road at grade across a track of the Ventura County Railway Company in the City of Oxnard, Ventura County, at the location described in the application to be identified as Crossing No. 45C-0.80.

Width of crossing shall be not less than 16 feet and grades of approach not greater than 5 percent. Construction shall be equal or superior to Standard No. 2 (General Order No. 72). Protection shall be by two Standard No. 1 crossing signs (General Order No. 75-B) reflectorized with reflex-reflective sheet material.

Construction expense of the crossing shall be borne by applicant.

Maintenance cost of the crossing outside of lines two feet outside of outside rails shall be borne by applicant. Ventura County Railway Company shall bear maintenance cost of the crossing between such lines.

Upon completion, the existing Wooley Road (westbound) crossing (Crossing No. 45C-0.85) located approximately 700 feet west shall be abandoned and physically closed.

No obstructions shall be placed or remain near the crossing signs which will impair the motorists' view.

Clearances shall conform to General Order No. 26-D. Within the area of the grade crossing construction walkways for a distance of 6' from the rail on both sides of the track shall provide a reasonable regular surface with gradual slope not to exceed 1" vertical to 8" horizontal in all directions of approach in accordance with the provisions of General Order No. 118.

Within thirty days after completion pursuant to this order, applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall expire if not exercised within two years unless time be extended, or if compliance with above conditions are not met. The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
