SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER

Decision No. 78597 issued April 20, 1971, in this proceeding established a provision in Item 1850 of Exception Ratings Tariff 1 authorizing accounting card machines and copying, duplicating and reproducing machines to be transported loose by highway carriers. Said decision failed to provide that repair kits (not to exceed ten pounds) may be included with copying machines, as requested in Petition No. 632. Item 1850 should be amended accordingly.

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. Exception Ratings Tariff 1 (Appendix A to Decision No. 66195, as amended) is further amended by incorporating therein, to become effective June 5, 1971, First Revised Page 27-WWWW, attached hereto and by this reference made a part hereof.
2. Common carriers subject to the Public Utilities Act, to the extent that they are subject also to Decision No. 66195, as amended, are hereby directed to establish in their tariffs the amendments necessary to conform with the further adjustments ordered herein.

3. Tariff publications required to be made by common carriers as a result of the order herein shall be filed not earlier than the effective date of this order and may be made effective not earlier than the tenth day after the effective date of this order on not less than ten days' notice to the Commission and to the public and such tariff publications shall be made effective not later than June 5, 1971; tariff publications which are authorized but not required to be made by common carriers as a result of the order herein may be made effective not earlier than the tenth day after the effective date of this order, and may be made effective on not less than ten days' notice to the Commission and to the public if filed not later than sixty days after the effective date of the minimum rate tariff pages incorporated in this order.

4. Common carriers, in establishing and maintaining the ratings authorized hereinabove, are hereby authorized to depart from the provisions of Section 460 of the Public Utilities Code to the extent necessary to adjust long- and short-haul departures now maintained under outstanding authorizations; such outstanding authorizations are hereby modified only to the extent necessary to comply with this order; and schedules containing the ratings published under this authority shall make reference to the prior orders authorizing long- and short-haul departures and to this order.

5. In all other respects, Decision No. 66195, as amended, shall remain in full force and effect.

The effective date of this order shall be ten days after the date hereof.

<p>⊗MACHINES:</p> <p>Business or Office, viz.: Accounting Card (115740)                  Copying, Duplicating or Reproducing, NOI (118250)</p> <p>May be shipped loose subject to provisions of Notes 1, 2 and 3.</p> <p>NOTE 1.--The provisions of this item apply only in connection with transportation performed in a van-type vehicle commonly used for the transportation of household goods or electronic equipment and normally equipped with pads, covers, dividers and other protective materials, tie-downs and dollies necessary for such transportation.</p> <p>⊗NOTE 2.--The provisions of this item apply only in connection with transportation of straight shipments of the commodities referred to herein, *except that with shipments of commodities named in Item 118250 of the GC there may be included (not to exceed ten pounds in weight) kits, business or office copying, duplicating or reproducing machine (108030).</p> <p>NOTE 3.--The provisions of this item apply only in connection with shipments released to 50¢ per pound per article. The bill of lading issued for any shipment accepted for transportation at this rate shall have printed on the face thereof a statement reading as follows:</p> <p>"Unless a different value is declared, the shipper hereby releases the property to a value of 50¢ per pound per article."</p>	<p>⊗1850</p>
