SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER

Hecht Fast Freight, Inc. requests authority to extend the suspension of its highway common carrier authority.

The certificate of public convenience and necessity was acquired by Decision No. 63371 dated March 6, 1962, in Application No. 43995 as amended by Decision No. 74610 dated August 27, 1968, and authorizes transportation of new furniture between Los Angeles and San Diego.

By Decision No. 77132 dated April 21, 1970, in Application No. 43995, Hecht Fast Freight, Inc. was granted authority to suspend operations until April 21, 1971. Applicant has submitted a written request for authority to extend suspension of its authority for another six months to complete its business reorganization.

After consideration, the Commission finds that the proposed suspension of service would not be adverse to the public interest. A public hearing is not necessary.

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. Concurrent with the tariff filings required by Ordering Paragraph 2 hereof, the operating authority granted by Decision No. 63371 dated March 6, 1962, in Application No. 43995, as amended by Decision No. 74610 dated August 27, 1968, is hereby suspended.

2. Within thirty days after the effective date hereof and on not less than five days' notice to the Commission and to the public, applicant shall amend its tariff presently on file with this Commission to reflect the authority herein granted.

3. During the period of suspension, Hecht Fast Freight, Inc. shall continue to file quarterly reports and pay fees pursuant to Section 5003.1 of the Public Utilities Code.

4. Prior to the expiration date of the suspension period or the date service is resumed when the latter date is earlier than said expiration date, Hecht Fast Freight, Inc. shall file a list of motor equipment to be operated and file and have in effect evidence of adequate liability insurance protection in compliance with Commission General Order No. 100-F.






5. Tariff schedules naming rates and rules governing the common carrier operations herein shall be brought up to date in compliance with all applicable Commission minimum rate orders. The required tariff filings shall be made effective on not less than ten days' notice to the Commission and to the public and the effective date of the tariff filings shall be concurrent with the expiration date of the suspension period or the date when service is resumed when the latter date is prior to said expiration date.

6. The authority to suspend operations granted herein shall expire on November 15, 1971, or upon earlier resumption of operations which may be effected upon compliance with Ordering Paragraphs 3, 4 and 5.

Hecht Fast Freight, Inc. is placed on notice that commencement of operations under the certificate referred to in Ordering Paragraph 1 herein, prior to compliance with Ordering Paragraphs 3, 4 and 5, may be cause for further suspension or revocation of the operating authority of Hecht Fast Freight, Inc.

The effective date of this order shall be the date hereof.
