Application of the State of California,
Department of Public Works, for an order
authorizing the widening of existing
Magnolia Avenue Overhead, whereby State
Route 91 will be widened from 4 to 6
lanes over the tracks of the Southern
Pacific Transportation Company's Corona
Branch Line Track and a future track in
the City of Riverside, hereinafter
referred to as the "Magnolia Avenue
Overhead" (Widening).

O R D E R

State of California Department of Public Works is hereby authorized to reconstruct a crossing at separated grades of State Route 91 over the track of the Southern Pacific Transportation Company, in Riverside, Riverside County, at the location and substantially as shown by plans (Exhibit B) attached to the application, to be identified as Crossing No. BJ-554.8-A, formerly Crossing No. 6W-9.03-A. Construction and maintenance expense shall be borne in accordance with an agreement entered into between the parties relative thereto.

Clearances shall be in accordance with General Order 26-D, except that during the period of construction, a clearance of not less than 21'0" above top of rail is authorized and the Southern Pacific Transportation Company is authorized to operate with such reduced overhead clearance provided that instructions are issued by the railroad and filed with the Commission forbidding employees to ride on tops of cars. Applicant shall notify the Commission and

Southern Pacific Transportation Company at least 15 days but not more than 30 days in advance of the date when the temporary impaired clearance will be created. Walkway areas adjacent to Southern Pacific Transportation Company tracks shall be maintained free of obstructions and shall promptly be restored to their original condition in the event of damage during construction.

Within thirty days after completion pursuant to this order applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall expire if not exercised within three years unless time be extended or if conditions are not complied with.

Authorization may be revoked or modified if public convenience, necessity or safety so require.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
