O R D E R

The City of Compton is hereby authorized to construct Acacia Avenue at grade across a track of the Southern Pacific Transportation Company in the City of Compton, Los Angeles County, at the location described in the application to be identified as Crossing No. BBH-495.52-C.

Width of crossing shall be not less than 40 feet and grades of approach as shown on plans attached to the application. Protection shall be by two Standard No. 8 flashing light signals (General Order No. 75-B) augmented with additional flashing light signals on cantilever arms.

Construction expense of the crossing shall be borne by applicant.

Maintenance cost of the crossing outside of lines two feet outside of rails shall be borne by applicant. Southern Pacific Transportation Company shall bear maintenance cost of the crossing between such lines. Installation cost of the automatic crossing protection shall be borne by the applicant. Maintenance cost of the automatic protection shall be borne by the applicant, pursuant to the provisions of Section 1202.2 of the Public Utilities Code.

The crossing shall not be opened to public use until after the protection ordered herein is installed and operative. No obstructions shall be placed or remain near the flashing light signals which will impair the motorists' view.

Clearances shall conform to General Order No. 26-D. Within the area of the grade crossing construction walkways for a distance of 6' from the rail on both sides of the track shall provide a reasonable regular surface with gradual slope not to exceed 1" vertical to 3" horizontal in all directions of approach in accordance with the provisions of General Order No. 118.

Within thirty days after completion pursuant to this order, applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall expire if not exercised within one year unless time

be extended, or if above conditions are not complied with.
Authorization may be revoked or modified if public convenience,
necessity or safety so require. The effective date of this order
shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
