Application of the CITY OF OXNARD for an Order authorizing construction of a crossing at separated grades between Third Street and the tracks of the Southern Pacific Transportation Company, sometimes referred to as the "Third Street Overhead".

Application No. 52650 (Filed May 28, 1971)

ORDER

City of Oxmard is hereby authorized to construct a crossing at separated grades of Third Street over the trackage of Southern Pacific Transportation Company, in Oxmard, Ventura County, at the location and substantially as shown by plans (Exhibit B) attached to the application, to be identified as Crossing No. E-407.7-A. Construction and maintenance expense shall be borne in accordance with an agreement to be entered into between the parties relative thereto, and copy of said agreement, together with plans of said crossing approved by Southern Pacific Transportation Company, shall be filed with the Commission prior to commencing construction. Should the parties fail to agree, the Commission will apportion the cost of construction and maintenance by further order.

Clearances shall be in accordance with the requirements of General Order No. 26-D. Walkway areas adjacent to the tracks shall be maintained free of obstructions and shall promptly be restored to their original condition in the event of damage during construction.

Upon completion, the existing East Third Street crossing (Crossing No. E-407.7) located approximately 70 feet north shall be abandoned and physically closed.

Grade separation for Third Street has been established as Priority No. 8 by Decision No. 78134 in Case No. 9095 pursuant to Statutes 1957, Chapter 2091, amended Statutes 1959, Chapter 1763.
