### OPINION

Sharp Farms Trucking, Inc. (Sharp), a radial highway common carrier, engages in the transportation of agricultural commodities. Decision No. 77977, in this application, granted Sharp interim authority under Section 3666 of the Public Utilities Code to charge less than the established minimum rates on paddy rice in connection with transportation performed for Ray Tolson Rice Mill in Woodland, pending hearing. Said authority was extended by Decision No. 78615, and is scheduled to expire September 24, 1971.

Public hearing was held and the application submitted on July 9, 1971, in San Francisco. No one opposed the granting of the sought authority.

Evidence in support of the application was presented by applicant's president and a certified public accountant. Applicant's president explained that applicant engages in the hauling of grain, fertilizer, safflower seed and rice, in bulk. The transportation of rice accounts for approximately 50 percent of applicant's annual gross revenues. The hauling of rice is from the field to the rice drier (wet rice), from the drier to the rice mill (paddy rice) and from the rice mill to ports for export (milled rice). The transportation of paddy rice to rice mills accounts for approximately 25 percent of applicant's annual gross revenues. This witness also testified that the proposed rates, as revised in the Third Amendment to the application, will be compensatory and are necessary to retain the business

The certified public accountant presented in evidence studies of the costs of handling shipments from each of 54 points of origin to the plant of the Welco Rice Milling Company in Woodland. The costs were developed from the books and records of the company. The total cost for each haul was compared with the revenue for such haul under the rate proposed in the amended application. In each instance, the proposed rate exceeds the related total cost and provides an ample margin for profit.

In the circumstances, the Commission finds that the proposed less-than-minimum rates will be compensatory and such rates will be reasonable (Section 3666). The application, after hearing, should be granted and the rates authorized in the following order should be made to expire in one year.

### ORDER

#### IT IS ORDERED that:

by Sharp.

1. Sharp Farms Trucking, Inc., a corporation, is authorized to transport paddy rice for Welco Rice Milling Company from and to the points set forth in Appendix A, attached hereto, at rates less than the established minimum rates, but not less than those set forth, and subject to the conditions specified, in said Appendix A.

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2. On and after the effective date of this order, the rates set forth in Appendix A hereof shall supersede the rates set forth in Appendix A of Decision No. 77977, and the rates in Appendix A hereof shall expire September 24, 1972 unless sooner canceled, modified or extended by order of the Commission.

The effective date of this order is ten days after the date hereof.
