ORDER DENYING MOTION

On August 6, 1971 a "Motion for Order to Reopen Hearings and to Set Aside Submission" in the above-entitled proceeding was submitted by Donald C. Jameson. Since it was apparent that Mr. Jameson was not aware that a decision granting the application had been signed on August 3, 1971, the motion was accepted for filing as a petition for rehearing. Therefore, Elassification of the motion of Mr. Jameson as a petition for rehearing is annulled without prejudice to his filing a petition for rehearing should he so desire and should he meet the qualifications set forth in Public Utilities Code Section 1731. The Motion for Order to Reopen Hearings and to Set Aside Submission is rejected as untimely, since a decision has already issued.
