SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER

By Decision No. 77963 dated November 24, 1970, in the above proceeding, the Commission granted a certificate of public convenience and necessity authorizing operations as a highway common carrier to Pearson Trucking & Rigging, Inc. It has been brought to our attention that said decision did not indicate that the certificate granted to A. R. Pearson Truck Co., Inc. was previously amended by Decision No. 74082, dated May 7, 1968, in Application No. 48547, and that such amendment was not reflected in Appendix A of Decision No. 77963.





In the circumstances, it appears, and the Commission finds, that the necessary correction should be made by the order herein. A public hearing is not necessary. The Commission

concludes that Decision No. 77963, supra, should be amended accordingly.

IT IS ORDERED that Appendix A of Decision No. 77963 is hereby amended by substituting First Revised Page 2 attached hereto and by reference made a part hereof in place of Original Page 2.

The effective date of this order shall be the date hereof.

3. Livestock, viz.: bucks, bulls, calves, cattle, cows, dairy cattle, ewes, goats, hogs, horses, kids, lambs, oxen, pigs, sheep, sheep camp outfits, sows, steers, stags or swine.
4. Commodities requiring protection from heat by the use of ice (either water or solidified carbon dioxide) or by mechanical refrigeration.
5. Liquids, compressed gases, commodities in semi-plastic form and commodities in suspension in liquids in bulk, in tank trucks, tank trailers, tank semitrailers or a combination of such highway vehicles.
6. Commodities when transported in bulk in dump trucks or in hopper-type trucks.
7. Commodities when transported in motor vehicles equipped for mechanical mixing in transit.

Note: The commodities excluded by the above exceptions Nos. 1 to 7, both inclusive, may nevertheless be carried by applicant if tendered for shipment with non-excepted commodities as part of the same shipment or movement.

8. Trailer coaches and campers, including integral parts and contents when the contents are within the trailer coach or camper.
