OPINION AND ORDER

By Decision No. 57063, dated July 29, 1958, in Case
No. 5432, Petition No. 107, Howard Wilson, doing business as Ace
Delivery, was granted an exemption from the minimum rates for the
transportation of wholesale drugs, wholesale electronics, and
electrical supplies and equipment in shipments of 100 pounds or less
between points within the area between South San Francisco and San
Jose and the Skyline Boulevard and San Francisco Bay. By this
application, Howard Wilson states he has incorporated his business
as Ace Delivery Express, Inc., and has transferred his highway carrier permits to the corporation. He now requests that the exemption
from the minimum rates be transferred from him, as an individual,
to the corporation. The application shows that the service as a corporation is no different from that performed by Wilson as an individual.

It is apparent, and the Commission finds, that the exemption granted to Howard Wilson, as an individual, should be continued to the new corporation that he has formed. We conclude that the application should be granted.
