## ORDER REOPENING PROCEEDING

The California Supreme Court on November 26, 1971, annulled Decision No. 77984 in the above entitled proceeding on the ground that the Commission had not considered lawful alternatives to the method decided upon by the Commission in said Decision by which to calculate income tax expense. Said Decision was an interim Decision and did not increase rates.

Parties to the proceeding have sought refund of that portion of the rate increases ascribable to the method used by the Commission to calculate income tax expense in the final Decision No. 78851 in the above proceeding. Petition for writ of review of Decision No. 78851 is now pending in said court.

In order to comply with the Court's decision of November 26, 1971, we find that the above entitled proceeding should be reopened for the purpose of considering lawful alternatives to the method used by the Commission in calculating income tax expense. No determination or plan respecting refunds can be made on the existing record in this proceeding. The Court has not ordered that a refund be made. However, in the reopened proceeding the Commission will receive evidence on the subject of refunds which may be ascribable to the method used in Decision No. 78851 to calculate income tax expense.

IT IS ORDERED that the above entitled proceeding is hereby reopened for the purpose of considering lawful alternatives to the method found proper by the Commission in Decision No. 77984 and used by it to calculate income tax expense in Decision No. 78851; and for the further purpose of receiving evidence on the subject of possible refunds, with appropriate interest, ascribable to the method used in Decision No. 78851 to calculate income tax expense.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Pacific shall continue to maintain records of intrastate charges to each of its customers (excluding coin box collections) as previously ordered in Decision No. 78851.

The Secretary is directed to cause this order to be mailed to all partics herein and to send notice of further hearing to such parties at least ten (10) days before the date of such hearing.
