In the Matter of the Application of SAN FRANCISCO WAREHOUSE COMPANY, a corporation for authorization to suspend operation of 4,000 square feet of public utility warehouse space in San Jose, California.

OPINION AND ORDER

San Francisco Warehouse Company requests authority to suspend operations as a public utility warehouseman in San Jose for a period of one year or until it finds suitable space in San Jose for its operations.

The authority is prescriptive in nature and authorizes operations in 4,000 square feet of space in San Jose. Said authority was acquired by applicant by Decision No. 60025, dated May 3, 1960, in Application No. 42037.

It is alleged that applicant lost its lease as of December 31, 1971, and that a number of months may be required for applicant to find suitable space in which to resume operation in San Jose.

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. San Francisco Warehouse Company may suspend operations as a public utility warehouseman in the City of San Jose until March 1, 1973.
