THIRD SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER

Richards Trucking, a corporation, requests authority to extend suspension of service as a petroleum irregular route carrier and as a cement carrier.

The operative rights to conduct statewide operations as a petroleum irregular route carrier were granted by Decision No. 44766, dated September 11, 1950, in Application No. 31149 and acquired by Richards Trucking by Decision No. 62878, dated December 5, 1961, in Application No. 43850.

The operative rights to conduct operations as a cement carrier were granted by Decision No. 76600, dated December 23, 1969,

in Application No. 51355 and authorize transportation from any and all points of origin to all points and places in the County of Los Angeles.

Decision No. 78499, dated March 30, 1971, in Applications Nos. 43850 and 51355, as amended, granted authority to Richards Trucking to suspend operations as a cement carrier and as a petroleum irregular route carrier.

Mr. Hansell U. Coulson, Trustee in Bankruptcy for Richards Trucking, has submitted a letter requesting that the present suspension of rights be extended in order to arrange for sale and transfer of the certificates.

After consideration, the Commission finds that the proposed extended suspension of service would not be adverse to the public interest and concludes that it should be granted. A public hearing is not necessary.

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. Concurrent with the tariff filings required by Ordering Paragraph 2 hereof, the operating authority granted by Decision No. 76600 dated December 23, 1969, in Application No. 51355 and the operating authority granted by Decision No. 44766, dated September 11, 1950, in Application No. 31149 and acquired by Richards Trucking by Decision No. 62878, dated December 5, 1961, in Application No. 43850 are hereby further suspended.

2. Within thirty days after the effective date hereof and on not less than five days' notice to the Commission and to the public, applicant shall amend its tariffs presently on file with this Commission to reflect the authority herein granted.

3. During the period of suspension, Richards Trucking, a corporation, shall continue to file annual report, quarterly reports and pay fees pursuant to Section 5003.1 of the Public Utilities Code.

4. Prior to the expiration date of the suspension period or the date service is resumed when the latter date is earlier than said expiration date, Richards Trucking, a corporation, shall file a list of motor equipment to be operated and file and have in effect evidence of adequate liability insurance protection in compliance with Commission General Order No. 100 Series.





5. Tariff schedules naming rates and rules governing the common carrier operations herein shall be brought up to date in compliance with all applicable Commission minimum rate orders. The required tariff filings shall be made effective on not less than ten days' notice to the Commission and to the public and the effective date of the tariff filings shall be concurrent with the expiration date of the suspension period or the date when service is resumed when the latter date is prior to said expiration date.

6. The authority to suspend operations granted herein shall expire on December 4, 1972, or upon earlier resumption of operations which may be effected upon compliance with Ordering Paragraphs 3, 4 and 5.

7. Richards Trucking, a corporation, is placed on notice that commencement of operations under the certificates referred in Ordering Paragraph 1 herein, prior to compliance with Ordering Paragraphs 3, 4 and 5, may be cause for further suspension or revocation of the operating authority of Richards Trucking, a corporation.

The effective date of this order shall be the date hereof.
