ORDER OF DISCONTINUANCE

Citizens Utilities Company of California, on September 14, 1971, filed Advice Letter No. 100 and tariff sheets offering private fire protection service for the first time in the Montara District.

Dr. Goldthorpe, Administrator and Medical Director of the Moss Beach Rehabilitation Hospital, by letter received September 25, 1971, asked that the filing be suspended and a hearing set. The letter did not give any reasons for requesting the suspension.

By order dated October 19, 1971, the Commission suspended the filing of the tariff sheets in question, pending hearing.

Public hearing was held before Examiner Porter at Moss Beach on December 6, 1971, at which time the matter was submitted.


The suspension period of Citizens Utilities Company of California's Advice Letter No. 100 expired on January 12, 1972 without the Commission having issued a decision herein. On January 14, 1972, Citizens Utilities Company of California filed Advice Letter No. 103 which refiled Schedule MO 4-1, Private Fire Protection Service, Montara Tariff Area, effective January 15, 1972.


In view of such expiration and the subsequent filing the Commission will discontinue the investigation and suspension in Case No. 9282.


Therefore, IT IS ORDERED that the investigation and suspension in Case No. 9282 is discontinued.
