O R D E R

Southern Pacific Transportation Company is hereby authorized to construct an industrial drill track at grade across Western Avenue and Monarch Street in the City of Garden Grove, County of Orange, at the locations described in the application, to be identified as Crossing Nos. BAA-516.03-C and BAA-516.27-C, respectively. Construction of each crossing shall be equal or superior to Standard No. 2 of General Order No. 72. Width of the Western Avenue crossing shall be 64 feet and the Monarch Street crossing shall be 50 feet and grades of approach at each crossing shall not exceed one percent in accordance with plans attached to the application. Protection at each crossing shall be by two Standard No. 8 flashing light signals (General Order No. 75-B) augmented with additional flashing light signals on cantilever arms. No obstructions shall be placed or remain near the crossings which will impair the motorists' view of the signals. No train, engine or car shall be operated over either crossing until after the protection ordered herein is installed and operative.

Applicant shall bear entire construction and maintenance expense of each crossing.

Clearances, including any curbs, shall conform to General Order No. 26-D. Walkways shall conform to General Order No. 118 in that the transition slope between walkways required under General

Order No. 118 and top of roadway shall provide a reasonable regular surface with gradual slope not to exceed 1" vertical to 8" horizontal in all directions of approach.

Within thirty days after completion pursuant to this order, applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall expire if not exercised within one year unless time be extended or if above conditions are not complied with. Authorization may be revoked or modified if public convenience, necessity or safety so require.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
