<u>ORDER</u>

The County of Ventura is hereby authorized to reconstruct a crossing at separated grades of South Bank Drive under the track of the Southern Pacific Transportation Company near Oxnard in the County of Ventura at the location and substantially as shown by plans (Exhibit B) attached to the application, identified as Crossing No. E-404.5-B.

Construction and maintenance expense shall be borne in accordance with an agreement to be entered into between the parties relative thereto, and a copy of said agreement together with plans of said crossing approved by the Southern Pacific Transportation Company shall be filed with the Commission prior to commencing construction. Should the parties fail to agree, the Commission will apportion the cost of construction and maintenance by further order.

Clearances shall be in accordance with General Order No. 26-D. Walkway areas adjacent to the railroad tracks shall be maintained free of obstructions and shall promptly be restored to their original condition in the event of damage during construction.

Within thirty days after completion pursuant to this order applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall expire if not exercised within three years unless the time be extended or if conditions are not complied with.
