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No evidence was received and, therefore, for lack of prosecution and proof, the application will be denied.

IT IS ORDERED that the above-entitled application of Richard Edward Harney, an individual, doing business as Palomar Transport, for a Class B certificate to operate as a charter-party carrier of passengers is hereby denied.
