ORDER DENYING
TEMPORARY RESTRAINING ORDER

Complainants allege that tariffs of Defendant requiring inter-connecting devices which purportedly protect Defendant's system from adverse voltages occurring within customer-provided equipment create an unnecessary and undue burden, additional expense, and engineering problems. Complainants' request the following order:

- "1. That Defendant be given a temporary restraining order and be required to provide service to the customers of American Telephonics;
2. That Complainant (sic) be permitted to operate said COAM systems without interface arrangement C2ACP, using only a simple plug and jack arrangement.
3. For such other and further relief as this Honorable Commission deems proper."

Inasmuch as there is no allegation of immediate and irreparable injury which cannot be abated other than by an immediate ex parte order, there does not appear sufficient grounds to warrant the extraordinary relief requested.




The Complainants' request for a temporary restraining order is denied without prejudice.
