ORDER GRANTING MOTION TO REOPEN RECORD TO RECEIVE MOST  
RECENT TRAFFIC DATA, SUBJECT TO RIGHT OF CROSS-EXAMINATION

On March 23, 1972, Golden Pacific Airlines, Inc. (GPA), protestant in the above-named proceeding, filed a motion requesting that the record be reopened for the purpose of receiving the 1971 traffic data for its Eureka-San Francisco service.

The motion states that the information updates the traffic data introduced by GPA during the hearing in this proceeding, and that it is vital to a sound decision in this case.

On March 21, 1972, the Commission granted a similar motion filed by Air West. No objections to GPA's motion have been filed.

The Commission concludes that the motion should be granted. An additional day of hearing has been set for May 16, 1972 to have Air West's data introduced into the record. GPA may introduce its data at the same time, subject to cross-examination and the opportunity to respond to the data.
