## SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER

By Decision No. 79413, dated November 23, 1971, in this application, Bulk Transportation was granted temporary authority to assess a rate less than the minimum for the transportation of processed silica sand for Anchor Hocking Corporation from the Mission Viejo plant of Owens-Illinois Glass Company in San Juan Capistrano to Maywood. The authority is scheduled to expire May 23, 1972.

Applicant has now informed the Commission that Owens-Illinois has been unable to commence production at its San Juan Capistrano plant because of unanticipated start-up problems and equipment breakdowns. No transportation has been performed under the interim order. Applicant states that no purpose would be served in having a hearing on the application until it has had an opportunity to conduct operations and analyze the results thereof. Applicant thus requests a three-month extension of the interim authority.

It appears, and the Commission finds, that the temporary authority should be extended to September 1, 1972, and a hearing held in June or July.

IT IS ORDERED that the authority granted by Decision No. 79413, in this proceeding, is extended to expire with September 1, 1972.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
