## OPINION

By its Interim Order set forth in Decision No. 79723, dated February 15, 1972, in the above application, the Commission granted applicants, Charles J. and Mary L. Agee, the opportunity to take a third household goods carrier examination and provided that if applicant who takes the examination fails, the application shall be denied Applicants on the two previous examinations failed to qualify as a household goods carrier.

The third examination was taken on March 30, 1972 by applicant Mary L. Agee, who established adequate knowledge to engage in business as a household goods carrier exclusively as to hourly and piece rate operations. The Commission finds that applicants have met the requirements of Section 5135 of the Public Utilities Code and concludes that the application should be granted, provided all other requirements are met.

## ORDER

IT IS ORDERED that Application No. 52777 is granted, provided all other requirements for issuance of a household goods carrier permit authorizing hourly and piece rate operations are met.
