SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER

By Decision No. 59567, dated February 1, 1960, in this proceeding J. D. Transportation Co., a corporation, doing business as Harbor Truck Lines, acquired a certificate of public convenience and necessity to transport general commodities between various points in the State as a highway common carrier. This authority was originally recognized as a prescriptive right by Decision No. 18766, dated September 3, 1927, in Application No. 14029.

The certificate was suspended effective September 7, 1970 for failure to maintain on deposit adequate liability insurance. The permitted authority held by the carrier was scheduled for revocation October 27, 1970 for failure to pay Transportation Rate Fund fees, estimated in the amount of \$3,520. A notice of levy on the permits and certificate issued to this carrier was filed with the Commission on October 16, 1970 by the Internal Revenue Service and the revocation of the operating authority was deferred. On March 29, 1972, the Internal Revenue Service issued a release of levy on the carrier's operating authority.





Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS ORDERED that the certificate of public convenience and necessity to operate as a highway common carrier acquired by J. D. Transportation Co. by Decision No. 59567, dated February 1, 1960, in Application No. 41770 is hereby revoked effective June 30, 1972, unless on or before such date all fees and fines due the Commission are paid and service is resumed or an application is filed to further suspend the certificate.

The Secretary is directed to cause service of this order to be made by mail upon J. D. Transportation Co.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
