O R D E R

County of Orange is hereby authorized to construct Weir Canyon Road at separated grades over the main line of The Atchison, Topeka and Santa Fe Railway Company, near Yorba Linda, Orange County, at the location described and in the manner as shown in the application, to be identified as Crossing No. 2B-35.8-A.

Clearances shall be in accordance with the provisions of General Order No. 26-D.

Walkway areas adjacent to The Atchison, Topeka and Santa Fe Railway Company tracks shall be maintained free of obstructions and shall promptly be restored to their original condition in the event of damage during construction.


Construction and maintenance costs shall be borne in accordance with an agreement to be entered into between the County of Orange and The Atchison, Topeka and Santa Fe Railway Company and a copy of said executed agreement, together with plans approved by the railway, shall be filed with the Commission prior to commencement of construction. Should the parties fail to agree, the Commission will apportion the costs by further order.


Within thirty days after the completion pursuant to this order, applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall expire if not exercised within three years unless time be extended or if above conditions are not complied with.


Authorization may be revoked or modified if public convenience, necessity or safety so require.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
