SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER

By Decision No. 79815, dated March 15, 1972, in this proceeding, John A. Raggio, doing business as Minute Man Delivery Service, was authorized to continue to assess less-than-the-minimum rates for the transportation of shipments not exceeding 20 pounds for C. Rodolph Guth Pharmaceuticals from San Francisco to points in Marin and Sonoma Counties but was not authorized to increase such rates, as requested, due to order of the Federal Price Commission imposing a temporary freeze on rates charged by carriers. The temporary freeze on rates has expired.

In the circumstances, it appears, and the Commission finds, that the rate adjustments sought by applicant are reasonable and justified. A public hearing is not necessary. The Commission concludes that the increases granted will not contribute to inflationary expectations and are necessary to assure continued and adequate service. Therefore, they fall within the guidelines established pursuant to the Federal Government's economic stabilization program as more specifically set forth in the certificate attached hereto as Appendix A.

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IT IS ORDERED that:

1. John A. Raggio, doing business as Minute Man Delivery Service, is authorized to transport shipments weighing 20 pounds or less for C. Rodolph Guth Pharmaceuticals from San Francisco to points in Marin and Sonoma Counties at rates less than the minimum rates set forth in Minimum Rate Tariff 2 but not less than those specified, and subject to the conditions set forth, in Appendix B attached hereto and by this reference made a part hereof.

2. The authority herein granted shall expire one year after the effective date of this order unless sooner canceled, modified or extended by order of the Commission.

This order shall become effective on the date hereof.

APPENDIX A

Certificate of the Public Utilities Commission of the State of California Re Increases in Rates for Certain Transportation Services Performed by John A. Raggio

Pursuant to provisions of Section 300.16 of the Economic Stabilization Act Amendments of 1971, the Public Utilities Commission of the State of California does hereby certify to the Federal Price Commission as follows:

1. The decision of the California Public Utilities Commission to which this certification is attached authorizes one individual carrier to increase by approximately 7 percent the rates it has been assessing since March 23, 1971, for the transportation of shipments weighing 20 pounds or less from San Francisco to points in Marin and Sonoma Counties (the greatest distance not exceeding 75 miles). The authorized rates are less than the Commission's established minimum rates for like transportation performed by other carriers.

2. The increased rates reflect cost conditions existing as of January 1, 1972. Said rate increases are cost-based and do not reflect future inflationary expectations.

3. The rate increases are the minimum required to assure continued, adequate and safe service by the carrier engaged in the transportation involved herein.

4. The dollar amount of the increased annual revenue, which the increases in rates are expected to produce, is about \$1,000.

5. The rate increases are not more than those sufficient to return to the carrier increases in operating costs which the carrier has experienced and which are not reflected in its present rates for the transportation involved herein.

<u>Carrier</u>: JOHN A. RAGGIO, doing business as Minute Man Delivery Service.

Shipper: C. Rodolph Guth Pharmaceuticals.

<u>Commodity</u>: Shipments not exceeding twenty pounds.

<u>Charge</u>: Per shipment from San Francisco:

To Marin County Zone	\$2.73	(See Note I)
To City of Novato Zone		(See Note 2)
To Sonoma County Zone		(Sec Note 3)

Minimum Charge: \$35 per week.

- Note 1 Marin County Zone includes the cities of Sausalito, Mill Valley, Tiburon, Larkspur, Corte Madera, San Anselmo, Ross, Fairfax, San Rafael and the unincorporated areas between said cities and within a 5-mile lateral of U.S. Highway 101, and Sir Francis Drake Boulevard.
- <u>Note 2</u> City of Novato Zone includes the area within the corporate limits of Novato.
- <u>Note 3</u> Sonoma County Zone includes the cities of Petaluma, Cotati, Rohnert Park, Santa Rosa and Sebastopol and the unincorporated areas of Sonoma County situated between said cities and within a 5-mile lateral of U.S. Highway 101, State Highway 116 and State Highway 12.
- <u>Billing</u>: Carrier shall bill shipper monthly on the first day of the calendar month for the service performed for the calendar month period preceding said billing date; shipper shall pay carrier within seven days of presentation of said monthly bill.
