ORDER OF DISMISSAL

On April 26, 1971 complainants filed a complaint alleging that the defendant intended to begin construction of a 230 kv transmission line in San Diego. Complainants opposed the construction on various grounds. Defendant, on May 14, 1971 filed its answer to the complaint denying all material allegations in the complaint.

Since that time the staff of the Commission has been in contact with the parties in an attempt to settle the matter. After investigation, it appeared to the staff that complainants did not wish to continue. On April 7, 1972 the staff wrote to complainants

stating that "It is our understanding that complainants do not wish to pursue Case No. 9216 any further. If the Commission does not receive a written request within 30 days from the date of this letter to set the matter for hearing, the case will be dismissed." No answer to the April 7, 1972 letter has been received.

Therefore, good cause appearing, the complaint in Case No. 9216 is dismissed.
