<u>ORDER</u>

The City of Fremont is hereby authorized to construct a crossing at separated grades of Paseo Padre Parkway under the track of Southern Pacific Transportation Company in the City of Fremont in the County of Alameda at the location and substantially as shown by plans (Exhibit B) attached to the application, to be identified as Crossing No. DAB-40.8-B.

Construction and maintenance expense shall be borne in accordance with an agreement to be entered into between the parties relative thereto, and a copy of said agreement, together with plans of said crossing approved by Southern Pacific Transportation Company, shall be filed with the Commission within 130 days from the date hereof. Should the parties fail to agree, the Commission will apportion the cost of construction and maintenance by further order.

Clearances shall be in accordance with General Order No. 26-D. Walkway areas adjacent to the railroad tracks shall be maintained free of obstructions and shall promptly be restored to their original condition in the event of damage during construction.
