ORDER DENYING
TEMPORARY CEASE AND DESIST

Complainant filed a verified complaint in the above-entitled action and a request for a temporary cease and desist order against defendants.

Complainant alleges that defendant The Gray Line Tours Company violated its tariffs on file with this Commission by charging less than the tariff rates on certain tours from May 1 through May 3, 1972.

Complainant further alleges that defendant Leigh Zarembo operated as a passenger stage corporation without authorization from this Commission between the dates of April 30 and May 3, 1972.

There is no allegation that either defendant is continuing the activities of which complainant complains, or that such activities are causing complainant irreparable harm which can only be abated by the extraordinary relief requested. Therefore, complainant's request for an immediate temporary cease and desist order must be denied.
