OPINION

Happy Valley Telephone Company seeks an order of the Commission authorizing it to enter into a Loan Agreement for the borrowing of \$75,000, and to issue notes and execute and deliver a mortgage and supplemental mortgages in accordance with such agreement.

Applicant is a California corporation furnishing telephone service in and about the community of Anderson in Shasta County. For the year 1971 it reports operating revenues and net income in the respective amounts of \$163,803 and \$21,834. Its reported balance sheet at December 31, 1971, is summarized as follows:

The application indicates that the company has continued to experience increasing demand for added and higher grades of telephone service, necessitating substantial additions to central office equipment and outside plant facilities at an estimated cost in excess of \$75,000.

For the purpose of providing funds to finance, in part, such additions, applicant has negotiated a Loan Agreement with Stromberg-Carlson Corporation whereby short-term borrowings in an aggregate principal amount of not exceeding \$75,000 would be made available as needed and would be evidenced by demand notes. Interest on said demand notes would be payable monthly at a rate per annum 2-1/2% over the New York City Bank prime interest rate in effect on the first day of each month. On or before December 31, 1973, a final note in the principal amount of not exceeding \$75,000 would be substituted for said demand notes and would be secured by

- 3. This order shall become effective when Happy Valley Telephone Company has paid the fee prescribed by Section 1904(b) of the Public Utilities Code, which fee is \$150.
