APPLICATION OF THE COUNTY OF SANTA CRUZ, A POLITICAL SUBDIVISION OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA, FOR PERMISSION TO RECONSTRUCT THE EXISTING UNDERPASS OF THE SOUTHERN PACIFIC TRANSPORTATION COMPANY, AT RAILROAD CROSSING (EC-108.9B).

O R D E R

The County of Santa Cruz is hereby authorized to reconstruct a crossing at separated grades of San Andreas Road under the track of the Southern Pacific Transportation Company and near Aptos in the County of Santa Cruz at the location and substantially as shown by plans (Exhibit A) attached to the application identified as Crossing No. EC-108.9-B.

The priority list of grade separation projects for the year 1972 as set forth in Decision No. 79466 shows this project as Priority No. 18.

Construction and maintenance expense shall be borne in accordance with an agreement to be entered into between the parties relative thereto, and a copy of said agreement, together with plans of said crossing approved by the affected railroad company shall be filed with the Commission prior to commencing construction. Should the parties fail to agree, the Commission will apportion the cost of construction and maintenance by further order.

Clearances shall be in accordance with General Order No. 26-D.

Walkway areas adjacent to the railroad tracks shall be maintained free of obstructions and shall promptly be restored to their original condition in the event of damage during construction.

Within thirty days after completion pursuant to this order applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall expire if not exercised within three years unless the time be extended or if conditions are not complied with. Authorization may be revoked or modified if public convenience, necessity, or safety so require. The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
