ORDER DENYING EMERGENCY
RELIEF AND SETTING HEARING

Complainant alleges that on or about June 20, 1972, it applied to defendant for a new trunk line and an off-premise extension, but that defendant illegally has refused to provide the service to the economic loss of complainant. Complainant seeks, among other relief, an order requiring defendant to provide the requested service forthwith and that defendant cease and desist from delaying complainant in the conduct of its business.

The Commission is of the opinion that emergency relief is unwarranted based solely on the complaint. However, to minimize any economic injury to complainant, the Commission will set this matter for hearing on an expedited basis.

The request for emergency relief is denied. This matter is set for hearing on less than 10 days' notice before Examiner Gillanders at 10 a.m. at the Commission Courtroom, State Building, 107 So. Broadway St., Los Angeles, California, on August 22, 1972.
