ORDER OF DISMISSAL

Pacific Power & Light Company seeks authority to assign to Wyopac Services, Inc. certain properties used in connection with the utility's Dave Johnston plant located near Glenrock, Wyoming. The latter corporation would lease such properties to applicant.

On the basis of the verified application the Commission finds that:

1. Applicant is a corporation organized under the laws of the State of Maine.
2. Applicant is engaged principally in the business of generating, purchasing, transmitting, distributing and selling electric energy in the States of California, Idaho, Montana, Oregon, Washington and Wyoming. It also supplies water, steam heat and telephone service in various communities in its service area, but not in the State of California.
3. For the year 1971, 5.3% of applicant's total reported revenues originated in the State of California.

4. Wyopac Services, Inc., a wholly owned subsidiary of Pacific Power & Light Company, is a corporation organized under the laws of the State of Oregon.
5. The properties involved in this proceeding are located in the State of Wyoming, and used in mining and delivering coal.

Based upon the foregoing findings we conclude that the application should be dismissed for lack of jurisdiction. A public hearing is not necessary.

IT IS ORDERED that Application No. 53485 is hereby dismissed.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
