SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER REVOKING
OPERATING AUTHORITY

By Decision No. 25979, dated May 29, 1933, Russell S. Stowell, doing business as Western Parcel Service, was granted a certificate of public convenience and necessity as a highway common carrier to transport small packages from San Diego to San Ysidro, El Cajon, Coronado and intermediate points.

Stowell filed bankruptcy in the U.S. District Court for the Southern District of California, No. 1081 and was adjudged a bankrupt on February 20, 1967. At the request of the carrier's attorney, the certificate was suspended to January 30, 1969 by resolution and later extended to December 31, 1970.

Upon inquiry made by the Commission staff on July 7, 1972, the referee in bankruptcy stated that he had no objection if the certificate was revoked.

Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS ORDERED that the certificate of public convenience and necessity to operate as a highway common carrier acquired by Russell S. Stowell, doing business as Western Parcel Service, pursuant to Decision No. 25979, dated May 29, 1933, in Application No. 18535, is hereby revoked.

The Secretary is directed to cause service of this order to be made upon Russell S. Stowell, or to mail a certified copy thereof to him at his last known address as shown in the Commission's records, and to mail a copy of this order to Harvey L. Pedersen, Hewitt, Klitgaard & Sharkey, Suite 2121, U.S. National Bank Building, San Diego, CA 92101.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
