## SUPRIEMENMAL OPINION AND ORDER

John Scannell, doing business as Scannell Brothers Drayage, holas authority from.this Comoission to operate as a highway common carrier of general commodities, as defincd in Scetion 2i3 of the Pubic Itilities Code, in an area generally bounded by San Francisco, Yuba City, Sacramento and Bakersfield.

The authoxity was granted in part by Decision No. 67724, dated August 18, 1964, in Application No. 45224. In addition, certificates of public convenience and necessity werc issued in Decision No. 51064, datce February 2, 1955 in Application No. 35608, and by Decision No. 60299, dated June 20, 1960, as amended by Decisions Nos. 74032 and 74541, dated Nay 7, 1968 and August 13, 1968, respectively, in Application No. 40883.

A letter has been received from the carriex winch recuests tinat his operating authorities be restated. In the eireumstances, the order which follows will provide for the revocation of the cextificates paescntly held by John scannell and the issuance of a new certificate in appendix fom. Tho new certificate wini aiso authorize the carrier to transport general comoaities to all points and piaces within 20-mile radij of the City Iimits of Sacramento and

Fresno: . Paragraphs (q) and ( $r$ ), Appendix A, Original Page 3 , of Decision No. 67724 inadvertently omitted the mileage limitation in describing the radii. A public hearing is not necessary. The new certificate issued to John scannell will not broaden or change the interstate or foreign comerce rights held by the carrier:

John Scannell, doing business as Scannell Brothers Drayage, is hereby placed on notice that operative rights; as such; do not constitute a class of property which may be capitalized or used as an element of value in rate fixing for any amount of money in excess of that originally paid to the State as the consideration for the grant of such rights. ABide from their purely permissive aspect, these rights extend to the holder a full or partialmonopoly of a class of business. This monopoly feature may be modified or canceled at any time by the State, which is not in any respect limited as to the number of rights which may be given.

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. A certificate of public convenience and necessity is hereby granted to John Scannell, doing business as Scannell Brothers Drayage, authorizing him to operate as a highway common carrier, as defined in Section 213 of the Public utilities codeg. between the points and over the routes particularly set. forthin Appendix A attached hereto and made a part hereof.
2. The certificate of public convenience and necessity granted in paragraph $I$ of this order shall supersede the certificates of public convenience and necessity granted by, but not limited to, Decisions Nos. 51064, 60299 and 67724, which cextificates are hereby revoked, said revocation to become effective concurrently with the effective date of the tariff filings required by ordering paragraph 3 (0) hereof.
3. In providing service pursuant to the certificate herein granted, John Scannell, doing business as Scannell Brothers Drayage, shall comply with and observe the following service regulations. Failure to do so may result in cancellation of the
operating authority granted by this decision.
(a) Within thirty days after the effective date hereof, applicant shall file a written acceptance of the certificate heroin granted. Applicant is placed on notice that, if he accepts the certificate of puolic convenience and necessity herein granted, he will be required, among other things, to comply with and observe the safety rules of the California Eighway Patrol and the insurance requirements of the commission's General order No. 100-Series.
(b) Within one hundred twenty days after the effective date hereof, applicant shall amend his tariffs on file with the Commission to seflect the authority granted herein.
(c) The tariff filings shall be made effective not earlier than thirty days after the effective date of this onder on not less than thirty days' notice to the Commission and the public.
(d) The tariff filings made pursuant to this order shall comply with the regulations governing the construction and fining of tarisfs set forth in the commission ${ }^{\text {r }} \mathrm{s}$ General Oräer No. 30-Series.
(c) Applicant shali maintain its accounting recores on a calendar year basis in conformance with the applicable oniform System of Accounts or Chart of Accounts as prescribed or adopted by this comission and shall file with the Commission, on or before March 31 of each year, an annual report of its operations in such form. content, and number of copies as the commission, from time to time, shall proseribe.
(土) Applicant shall comply with the requirements of the Commission's General Order No. 84-Series for the transportation of collect-on-delivexy shipments. If applicant elects not to transport collect-on-delivery shipments; it shall make the appropriate tariff filings as required by the General oxder.

The effective date of this order shali be twenty days after the date hercof.

John Scannell, by the certificate of public convenience and necessity granted by the decision noted in the margin, is authorized to conduct operations as a highway common carrier, as defined in Section 213 of the Public Utilities Code, for the transportation of general commodities, subject to conditions and exceptions noted, as follows:
I. In intrastate commerce only, from San Francisco =0:-
4. All points and places on, along and within three miles laterally of the following routes:

1. State Highway 99 between Modesto and Bakersfield, Including the oft-route points of Sanger, Reediey, Dinuba, Visalia, Exeter, Lindsay, Porterville and Hanford.
2. State Highway 33 between Taft and its intersection with Inters cate Highway 205.
3. State Highways 219 and 99 between Taft and Bakersfield.
4. State highway 88 between Stockton and Lockeford.
5. State Highway 26 between Stockton and Beilota.
6. State Highway 108 and county road J-6 between Pelota and Modesto.
7. State Highway 120 between Manteca and Oakdale.
8. State İigkway 108 between Oakdale and Modesto including Riverbank.
9. State Highway 232 between Modesto and Waterford.
10. State Highway 132 and county road J-7 between Modesto and Eughson.
11. State Highway 160 between Antioch and Sacramento including the offrroute points of Rio Vista and thornton.

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12. U. S. Higbway 101 between San Jose and Salinas.
13. State Highway 152 between Gilroy and Califa.
14. Interstate HIghway 80 and State HLghway 65 between Sacramenco and Yuba CLty.
15. Seate Elghways 99 and 113 and Interstate Highway 80 between Sacxamento and Yuba Clity.
16. State Elghway 29 between Vallejo and Napa.
B. All points and places within the following areas:

1. The County of Contra Costa.
2. A 20-mile radius of the Clty Limits of Sacramento.
3. A 20-mile radius of the Clty Limits of Fresno.

## Conditions

With the exception of San Francisco, applicant may not link operations between points in Part I and those specified in Parts II and III.
II. Between all points, places and routes, and within 3 miles laterally of said routes, in intrastate, interstate and foreign comerce as follows:

1. Between the San Francisco-East Bay Cartage Zone, as
 thereto and between intexmediate points on U. S. Highway 101 and Scate Highway 82 , Lincluding the CLty of Los Altos.
2. Between the San Francisco-East Bay Cartage Zone and Saratoga and points intermediate chereto and between intemediate points on Saratoga-Sunnyale Road.
3. Between the San Francisco-East. Bay Gartage Zone and Los Gatos and polnts intermediate thereto and between intermediate points on Stace Highway 17, including the City of Campbell.
4. Between Los Gatos and Saratoga via State Highway 9.

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5. Between the San Franclisco-East Bay Cartage Zoney-Sacramento and intermediace points on Interstate Kighway 80.
6. Between the San Francisco-East Bay Cartage Zone, Sacramento and intermediate points on Interstate Highways $580,205,5$ and State Highway 99, including the Cities of Lodi, Stockton and Tracy.
7. Between Modesto and Stockton vis U. S. Highway 99:
8. Between Manteca and the junction of U. S. Highway 50 with State Kighway 120 and intermediate points on State Eighway 120.
III. From all points of origin to all points of destination within the San Francisco-East Bay Certage Zone as described in Note A in intrastate; interstate and foreign comerce.
IV. For operating convenience applicant may use any and all'streets, roads, highways and coll bridges necessary or conventent for the performance of the service herein authorized.
V. Carrier shall not transport any shipments of:

1. Used household goods and personal effects not packed in accordance with the crated property requirements set forth in Item 5 of Minfimum Rate Tariff 4-B.
2. Automobiles, trueks and buses, vix. : new and used, finished or unfinished passenger automobiles (including jeeps), ambulances, hearses and taxis; freight automobiles, automobile chassis, trucks, truck chassis, truck trailers, trucks and trailers combined, buses and bus chassis.
3. Livestock, viz.: barrows, boars, bulls, butcher hogs, calves, cattle, cows, dadry cartle, ewes, feeder pigs, gilts, goats, helfers, hogs, kids, lambs, oxen, pigs, tams (bucks), sheep, sheep camp outfits, sows, steers, stags, swine, or wethers.
4. Commodities requiring the use of spectal refrigeration or temperature control in specially designed and constructed refrigerator equipment.

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5. Liquids, compressed gases, comodities in semiplastic form and comodities in suspension in ilquids in bulk, in tank trucks, tank trailers, tank semitrailers or a combination of such highway vchicles.
6. Commodities when transported in bulk in dump trucks or in hopper-type trucks.
7. Commodities when transported in motor vehicies equipped for mechanical mixing in transit.
8. Logs.
9. Trailer coaches and campers, including integral parts and contents when the contents are within the trailer coach or camper.

## Note A

## SAN FRANCISCO-EAST bay cartace zone

The San Francisco-East Bay Cartage Zone includes the area embraced by the following boundary:

Beginning at the point where the San Francisco-San Miateo County Boundary Line meets the Pacific Ocean; thence easterly along said boundary line to Lake Niereed Boulevard; thence southerly along said Lake Mexced Boulevard to South Mayfair Avenue; thence westeriy along said Souch Mayfair Avenue to Crestwood Drive; chence southerly along Crestwood Drive to Sourbate ivenue; thence westerly along Southgate Avenue to Dinddux Drive; thence southerly and casterly along Maddux Drive to a point one mile west of State \#ighway 82; thence southeasterly along on imaginary line one mile west of and paralleling State Highway 82 ( 21 Camino Real) to its intersection with the southerly boundary line of the City of San Mateo; thence along said boundary line to U. S. Highway 101 (Bayshore Freeway); thence leaving said boundary line procecding to the junction of Foster City Boulevard and Beach Park Road; thence northerly and easterly along Beach Rark Road to a poine one mile south of State Highway 92; thence easterly along on imaginary line one mile southerly and paralleling State Highway 92 to its intersection with State Highway 17 (Nimitz Freeway); thence continuing northeasterly along an fmaginary line one mile southerly of and paralleling State Highway 92 to its interscetion with an imaginary ine one mile casterly of and parallelIng Seate Highway 238; chence northeriy aiong sald imaginary line one mile

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casterly of and paralleling State Highway 238 to 1 ts intexsection with "B" Strect, Hayward; thence easterly and northerly along "B" Street to Conter Street; thence northerly along Center Street to Gastro Valley Boulevard; thence westerly along Castro Valley Boulevard to Redwood Road; thence northerly along Redwood Road to Somerset Avenue; thence westeriy along Somerset Avenue and 168ch Street to Foothill Boulevard; thence northwesterly along Foochill Boulcvard to the southerly boundary line of the City of Oakland; thence easterly and northerly along the Oakland Boundary Inte to its intersection with the Alameda-Contra Costa County Boundary Line thence northwesterly along said County Line to fts intersection with Arlington iverue (Berkeley); thence northwesteriy along Arlington Avenue to a point one mille northeasterly of San Pablo Avenue (State Highway 123); thence northwesterly along an inaginary line one mile casterly of and paralleling San Pablo Averuc to its intersection with County Road 20 (Contra Costa County); thence wescerly along County Road 20 to Broadway Avenue; thence northerly along Broadway Avenue to San Pablo Avenuc (State Highway 123) to Rivers Street; thence westerly along Rivers Strect to lith Strect; thence northerly along llth Street to Johns Avenue; thence westeriy along Johns Avenue to Colitns Avenue; thence northerly along Collins Avenue to Morton Avenue; thence westerly along Morton Avenue to the Southern Pacific Company right-of-way and continuing westerly along: the prolongation of kiorton Avenue to the shoreline of San Pablo Bay; chence southerly and westerly along the shoreline and waterfront of San Pabio Bay to Point San Pablo; thence southerly along an imaginary Iine to the San Francisco waterfront at the foot of Market Street; thence westerly along sald waterfront and shoreline to the Pacific Ocean; chence southeriy along the shoreline of the Pacific Ocean to the point of beginaing.
