O R D E R

Southern Pacific Transportation Company is hereby authorized to construct an industrial drill track at grade across Howell Avenue in the City of Anaheim, County of Orange, at the location and substantially as shown by plan attached to the application, to be identified as Crossing No. BM-512.47-C.

Construction of the crossing shall be equal or superior to Standard No. 2 of General Order No. 72-A. Width of crossing shall be 40 feet and grades of approach not greater than three percent as shown on the plan attached to the application.

Clearances shall conform to General Order No. 26-D. Within the area of the grade crossing construction, walkways for a distance of 6' from the rail on both sides of the track, shall provide a reasonable regular surface with gradual slope not to exceed 1" vertical to 8" horizontal in all directions of approach in accordance with the provisions of General Order No. 118.

Protection shall be by two Standard No. 1 crossing signs (General Order No. 75-B) reflectorized with reflex-reflective sheet material.

Applicant shall bear the entire construction and maintenance expense of the crossing including the requisite crossing protection. Maintenance expense of the crossing outside lines two feet outside of rails shall be borne by the City of Anaheim.

No train, engine or car shall be operated over the crossing until the protection ordered herein is installed. No obstructions shall remain or be placed near the crossing which will impair the motorists' view of the crossing signs.

Within thirty (30) days after completion pursuant to this order, applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall expire if not exercised within one year unless time be extended or if conditions are not complied with. Authorization may be revoked or modified if public convenience, necessity, or safety so require.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
