ORDER DENYING APPLICATION

By Decision No. 30255, dated July 18, 1972, the Commission ordered that the application of Donald B. Hardin and Dottie Brown, a partnership, doing business as Hardin's Van Lines, for a household goods carrier permit, be denied unless, on or before August 1, 1972, a partner or managing employee passed an examination administered pursuant to Section 5135 of the Public Utilities Code.

On July 27, 1972, Donald B. Hardin, partner, passed an examination for only operations subject to hourly and piece transportation rates.

On July 31, 1972 and September 21, 1972, the applicants were notified by letters that the household goods carrier permit cannot be issued until evidence of public liability and property damage and cargo insurance is placed on file with the Commission as required by Section 5161 of the Public Utilities Code and the Commission's General Order No. 100-G. The required insurance filings have not been made.

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Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS ORDERED that the application of Donald B. Hardin and Dottie Brown, a partnership, doing business as Hardin's Van Lines, for a household goods carrier permit is hereby denied unless the required evidence of insurance coverage is filed with the Commission within twenty days after the effective date of this order.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
